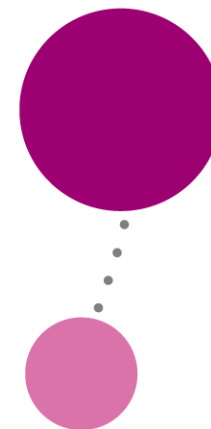

An introduction to the Early Years Speech & Language Support Practitioner



The **Early Years Speech & Language Support Practitioner Apprenticeship** is a Level 5 programme that develops early years practitioners and setting support staff into confident speech and language champions. It equips them with the skills to identify speech, language and communication needs, remove barriers and help children access early learning, play and development.

Developed by **Best Practice Network** in partnership with **Speech & Language Link**, the programme combines practical early years strategies with direct input from qualified speech and language therapists.

The role of the Apprenticeship Tutor

A key benefit of the programme is the dedicated apprenticeship tutor. Learners are not expected to work through the programme alone. Their tutor provides regular support, guidance and coaching, helping them connect the learning to real pupils, real provision and the day-to-day challenges they may face in school.

- Provides regular one-to-one guidance and coaching

Speech & Language-specific learning

Module 1 - What is SLCN?

- Build your understanding of Speech, Language and Communication Needs (SLCN)
- Learn the key terminology used by speech and language professionals
- Gain an overview of common speech, language and communication difficulties and diagnoses encountered in early years settings
- Discover how common SLCN is and why early identification matters
- Explore the wide-ranging impact of SLCN on children's development, learning, and life chances

Module 2 – Typical Development of Speech and Language Skills

- Discover how attention and listening skills develop and how they support the development of communication and learning
- Gain practical tips to support children's attention and listening skills throughout the day
- Explore typical speech and language development in the early years
- Understand the skills involved in processing language and recognise the impact of communication breakdowns

Module 3 - Creating a Communication Supportive Environment in the Early Years Setting

- Learn how to create communication friendly environments where every child can thrive
- Discover how a whole - setting approach can support all children's communication development

- Discover effective strategies to support children's speech, language, and communication skills
- Explore fun activities to help support speech sound development in the early years

Module 4 – Identifying SLCN and Taking Action

- Learn how to spot the early signs of speech, language, and communication difficulties.
- Build confidence in identifying potential speech sound and language development needs.
- Explore the important link between communication and behaviour.
- Explore the differences between SLCN and EAL and how to support multilingual children effectively.
- Understand the next steps when concerns arise, from monitoring and family partnership to specialist referrals.

Support every step of the way

Support in the workplace

Mentors are involved so participants can apply their learning effectively in their setting.

Who is this programme for?

Early Years Speech & Language Support Practitioner Apprenticeship L5

Designed for early years practitioners, room leaders and setting support staff who want to develop specialist expertise in speech, language and communication supports learners to have a greater impact on children's learning, development, participation and outcomes. Ideal for those supporting children who may struggle with:

- Understanding and using language
- Speech sound development
- Attention and listening
- Interaction, play and engagement

Build in-house speech and language expertise

Develop existing practitioners into confident speech and language champions who can apply practical strategies across the setting.

Strengthen inclusive provision

Help children with speech, language and communication needs access learning, play, routines and relationships more fully.

Improve consistency of support

Create a more joined-up approach between practitioners, room leaders, SENCOs, families and external professionals.

Support earlier identification

Equip staff to recognise possible communication needs sooner and respond with practical, evidence-informed support.

Reduce pressure on leaders and SENCOs

Develop practitioners who can contribute more confidently to observations, planning, adaptations and targeted support.

Make effective use of Growth and Skills Levy funding

Use levy funding to build specialist capacity within the setting without relying solely on existing training budgets.

How to apply

1. Apply online

Participants complete a short application through the Best Practice Network website.

2. We arrange the funding

Our friendly funding team will support the employer and manage the funding process.

3. Start with full support

Participants receive induction, onboarding and guidance before beginning the programme.

Funding

- Participants never pay a penny
- The £9,000 cost is covered by the Growth and Skills Levy (for eligible settings)
- Most settings access this through their local authority or MAT
- Growth and Skills Levy funding is already ringfenced for apprenticeship training
