# Early Years Practitioner Apprenticeship Level 2

It is also appropriate for Ofsted-registered childminders and Ofsted-registered childminder agencies. This is an important role to ensure the best possible educational outcomes are achieved for children with special educational needs and disabilities.

 Suitable for someone who is, or is aspiring to be, a manager of a private, voluntary and independent nursery, headteacher of a school-based or maintained nursery, or a childminder with leadership responsibilities.

## **Entry requirements**

- A full and approved Level 3 Early Years qualification or higher
- The qualification should have valid, reliable assessment and awarding procedures and must include an element of assessed performance evidence
- If you do not hold a full and approved level 3
   early years qualification you will be asked to
   provide a minimum of 100 words (max 200)
   detailing your experience relating to Early
   Years, Childcare or Play work.
